John Jorgenson Bluegrass Band



[It Happened One Night (1934) | October 3, 2014]

A spoiled heiress, running away from her family, is helped along on the road by a reporter actually hoping for a big-time news story on her disappearance. This combination of Rom-Com and Road Yarn won many Academy Awards including Best Picture, Actor, Actress, Director and Screenplay. The film was directed by Frank Capra and stars Clark Gable and Claudette Colbert.

[Sullivan's Travels (1941) | October 10, 2014]


A successful director of escapist films goes on the road disguised as a bum to learn the meaning of life by making a socially conscious film about the poverty stricken and along the way hooks up with a down-on-her-luck aspiring actress. It was directed by Preston Sturgess and stars Joel McCrea and Veronica Lake. The film was named one of the top ten films of the year by the National Board of Review.

[*Easy Rider* (1969) | October 24, 2014]

Two bikers set out on a cross-country road trip from So-Cal to Mardi Gras in search of America. Along the way, they traverse a variety of spectacular landscapes, encounter bigotry and hatred as well as a variety of alt-lifestyle '60s characters. It was directed by Dennis Hopper who stars along with Peter Fonda and Jack Nicholson. Nominated for Academy Awards for Best Supporting Actor and Screenplay and also nominated for the Palme d'Or at Cannes, where it won the award for best film by a new director.

Five Eαsy Pieces (1970) February 6, 2015

A drop out from an upper-class career as a classical pianist takes to the road, finding work in the oil fields. When he gets word that his father is dying, he sets out with his girlfriend to pay the family a visit. The movie was directed by Bob Rafelson and stars Jack Nicholson, Karen Black and Susan Anspach. It was nominated for four Academy Awards and Golden Globes including Best Picture, Actor, Director and Screenplay. Karen Black won the Golden Globe for Best Supporting Actress.

Wild At Heart (1990)





The film was directed by David Lynch who also wrote the screenplay from Barry Gifford's novel. It stars Nicholas Cage, Laura Dern, Diane Ladd, Willem Dafoe and Harry Dean Stanton. It received Academy Award and Golden Globe nominations for Best Supporting Actress and won the Palme d'Or for best film at Cannes.

Thelma & Louise (1991)

An Arkansas waitress and an unhappy housewife on a weekend getaway shoot an attempted rapist and take off down the road in a cross country chase with the authorities in hot pursuit. The film was directed by Ridley Scott and stars Susan Sarandon, Geena Davis, Harvey Keitel, Michael Madsen and Brad Pitt. It won the Academy Award for Best Screenplay, both Sarandon and Davis were nominated for Best Actress as was Ridley Scott for Director.


